

Family Contract Policy

Here at WonderED, we do our best to establish and maintain transparent communication with our families. In order to do this, we have introduced a variety of policies to ensure that the expectations are met between families and staff.

Our expectations are listed below, as well as what you can expect from WonderED:

Student Expectations

- Student/Success Advisor communication via weekly Google Meet; High Schoolers have the option of using the Talking Points app to check-in.
- Appropriate behavior/language at all times in the classroom, Google Meets and when communicating with teachers.
- Reach out to the Success Advisor if you are having trouble with anything.
- Finish MAP testing when required
- Complete a lesson in each of the classes you are assigned per day.
- No bullying we have **zero** tolerance for this behavior.

Parent Expectations

- Parents check email regularly for updates from the school and the child's Success Team.
- Appropriate behavior is expected from all parents, staff, and students.
- Use of Calendly links on the website, <u>WonderED Website</u>, to schedule one on one appointments with staff.
- Use the Parent Portal
- Parents are required to have a phone or video conference with the Success Advisor twice per school year.
- Parents need to schedule MAP testing 3 times a year for their students using Calendly or by calling the Success Advisor to arrange a meeting.

- Forms of communication for parents are email, the school main phone line (727-900-5186),
 Facebook/Instagram, and/or directly with Success Advisors as per their direct communications with students and families.

What you can expect from our online Success Team


- Someone who is respectful.
